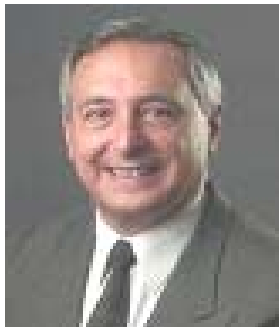

Carlo DiClemente received his MA in Psychology at the New School for Social Research and his Doctorate in Psychology at the University of Rhode Island and for over 25 years has explored the process of intentional behavior change in health and addictive behaviors. Dr. DiClemente is the co-developer of the Trans-theoretical Model of behavior change and the author of numerous scientific articles and book chapters on motivation and behavior change and the application of this model to a variety of problem behaviors. He is co-author of a self-help book , *Changing for Good*, and several professional books, *The Trans-theoretical Model*, *Substance Abuse Treatment and the Stages of Change*, and *Group Treatment for Substance Abuse: A Stages of Change Therapy Manual*. His most recent book, *Addiction and Change: How Addictions Develop and Addicted People Recover* was published by Guilford Press in 2003. For his work in the addictions he was given the Innovators Combating Substance Abuse award by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation in 2003 and the John P. McGovern Award from the American Society on Addiction Medicine (ASAM) in 2006. His is currently the Director of the Maryland Resource Center for Quitting Use and Initiation of Tobacco (MDQUIT.org) and continues to be engaged in research and consultation in the areas of smoking prevention and cessation, interventions for problem drinkers, mechanisms of behavior change in alcohol and substance abuse, and prevention and treatment of addiction and other chronic health problems. He has served as president of the APA Division on Addictions (50) is a Fellow of the American Psychological Association and the American Psychological Society.
